

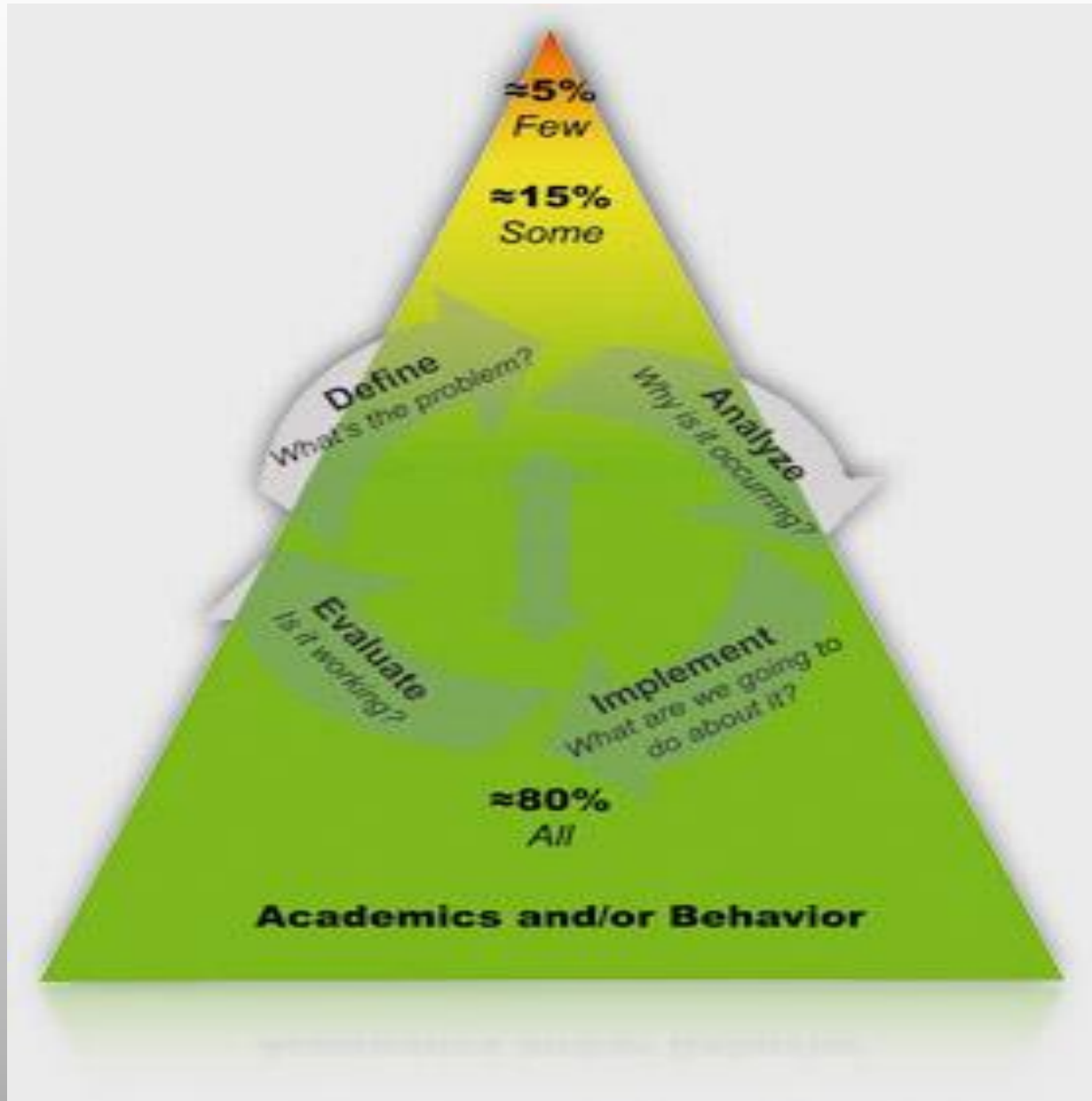

Training for All Teachers

In order for All Students to receive RTI assistance, teachers need the necessary training.

Stressed the need for Open Communication with teachers

Who Teaches RTI?

Everyone that teaches in the building is responsible for RTI. Everyone plays an important role in trying to catch each student up to grade level.

Can you absolutely catch each child, every day, before it is too late?

No, some students will fall into the cracks, but may not fall far. They are the students in the Gap that needs extra attention too.

Individuals that you hire or assign to do RTI are responsible for helping each student reach a higher level of academics.

Why do RTI?

Not all students get the same information on the first try. Some may need a second try, or even a third. Our job is to offer them as many tries that it takes for them to succeed.

Time and Place for RTI

Most Students that were identified for RTI would not stay after school for assistance nor come early.

Our RTI was designed to take place during the school day / hours.

Teachers were selected according to the students schedule and their elective classes.

Students were pulled from their electives only / Core Classes were not allowed to be touched.

Teachers that were assigned to do RTI were willing to give up one to two of their planning periods per week.

Funding for RTI

Funds to cover RTI to pay teachers during their planning periods was covered by ESS.

Day Time Working Wavier was completed to cover these funds.

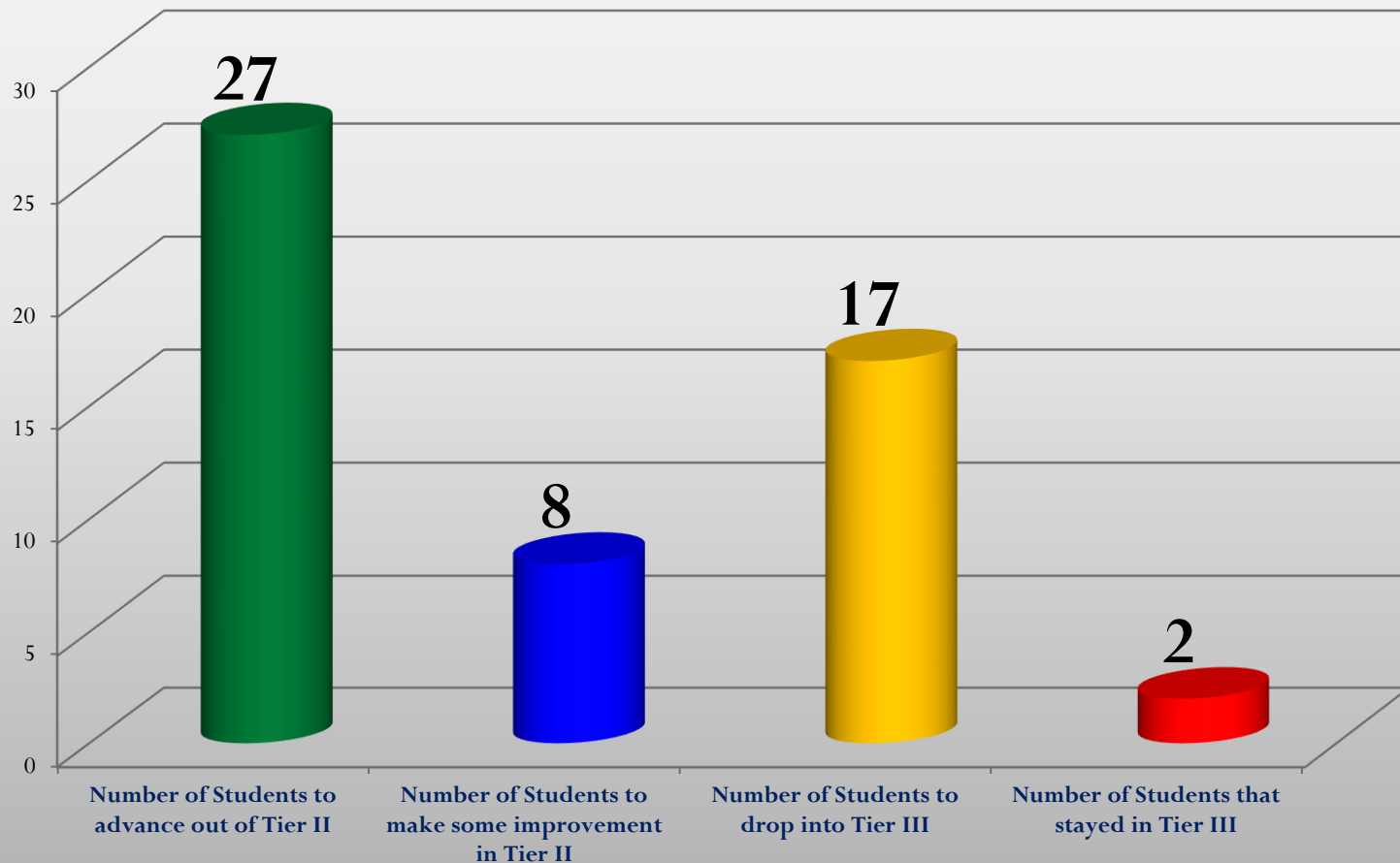

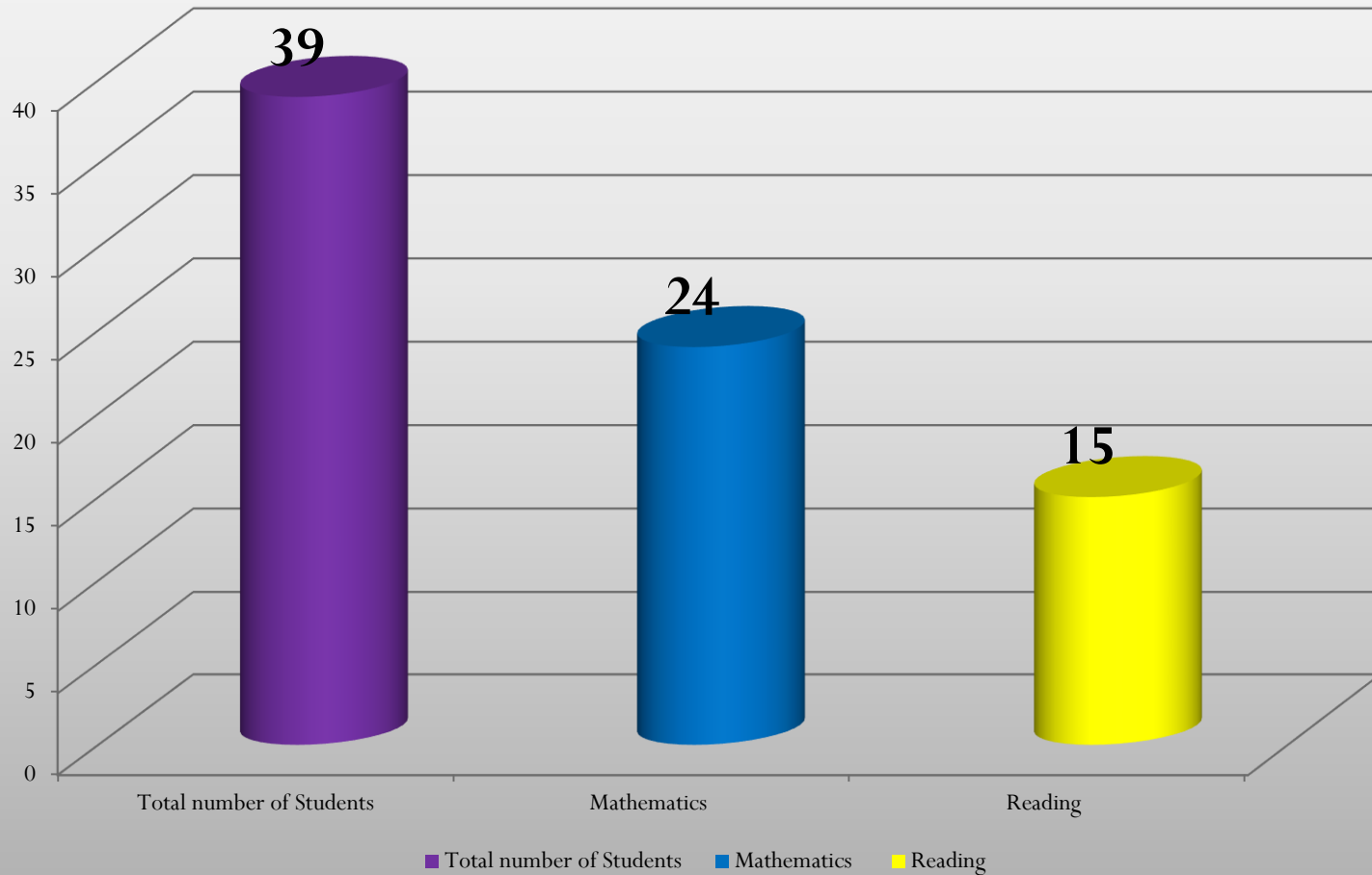
